

EPIPHANY PASTORAL VISITATIONS – Fr Joseph will be blessing homes during Epiphany Pastoral Visitations. He will call in advance to schedule the time convenient for the family. Normally the blessing of homes takes place from Christmas until the season of Lent. In different parts of the world the Feast of Three Kings is celebrated in festive parade as the beginning of the Carnival season. There are some customs associated with this feast

such as to bake King Cakes or fill a box with fresh grass and hay by children to feed the Wise Men's camels. In Some countries children walk from house to house and villagers will give almonds, dried figs, nuts, cookies or other good things that they have at home. In Poland the chalk and incense are blessed

and at home above the door the letters of Three kings are written "C+M+B+" and the year to provide protection against illness and misfortune for those within. The letters, with a cross after each one stand also for a Latin inscription meaning "Christ bless this house." "Christus mansionem benedicat."
