



Dear Parishioners – Thank you in advance for your generous support: You have all generously supported your parish, for which parish committee and I we are extremely thankful. Nevertheless, we ask you to prayerfully consider underwriting the cost of some needed supplies for the parish.

Dear parishioners,

The Holy Cross Church is getting ready to reopen. Our bishops sent letters to all parishes last week allowing the reopening of churches. I had two private meetings with the parish committee chairman to review the letter. We hope that parishioners will be able to attend Holy Mass Sunday May 31st. with necessary precautions. This date will need to be confirmed. A teleconference meeting was held on Tuesday May 19th and it was decided that every second pew can be used with three people seated per pew for a total of 42 people. Families with more than 3 people may all sit in the same pew. If we have an overflow of people in the church seating is available in the parish hall where the Mass can be seen and heard on closed circuit TV.

All parishioners will be required to wear a mask, if you do not have a mask, masks will be provided to those who need one. Purell sanitizer will be available to disinfect hands.

Coffee hour will be suspended for the time being, however socializing can take place with the **6 foot distancing rule** in the parish hall.

Since Holy Communion will not be distributed, the Spiritual Communion Prayer will be recited.

Priest and lectors will not wear masks in the sanctuary, however they will wear masks before and after leaving the sanctuary. During the mass two altar servers can be present. In order to keep the distance the altar servers will ring the bells instead of bringing the wine and water to the priest. There will also be restrictions on the pew books and the distribution of weekly bulletins.

For those parishioners who chose to remain at home, the **11am live** stream on Facebook will be continued.

As we slowly and cautiously have to get used to the new norm in our lives and those of worshiping in our church, all activities and fundraisers will be postponed until they are permitted.
