Spiritual reflection for Ash Wednesday:



Ash Wednesday

Beginning on Ash Wednesday (Feb. 17, 2021) we are called to repent, to change our minds about the way we live our lives in the sight of God. In the reading from the Book of the Prophet Joel we will hear that he summoned everyone, young and elderly to an assembly of prayer indicating that they were repenting. Ash Wednesday summons everyone to enter into a forty-day

fast and prayer. All are invited to give alms. We will all gather on Ash Wednesday because we know that we need to "to return to the Lord." Joel tells us that we can do that only by returning with our whole hearts, that is, with a motivation that is deep inside us. The ashes on our foreheads will indicate that we are entering in the Lenten period of change that will leave us never to be the same again. During the season of Lent all parishioners are welcome to attend on Fridays Stations of the Cross at 7:15 PM. This will give us the opportunity to reflect upon the redemptive sufferings of our Lord and Savior.



FIRST HOLY COMMUNION - The weekly classes are held at 10 am on Sunday. To date we have five (5) children and thee (3) adults taking classes. The Holy Eucharist is Jesus Christ who is really present under the forms of bread and wine. In the Eucharist, Jesus Christ gives us Himself as a food for our

souls. The bread and wine become the Body and Blood of our Lord during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass when the priest says words of consecration which Jesus used during the Last Supper: This is My Body... This is My Blood. (Catechism)



Confirmation Classes – To date we have eight (8) students, (youth and adults) taking classes. Please contact parish office to register or contact Fr. Joseph after Sunday Mass. The classes are held after the 11 am Mass. Students who are in the 7th grade and older and adults


