INTRODUCTION

My friends, today we celebrate the anniversary of the institution of the Polish National Catholic Church. Our Church has roots in the Church in Jerusalem established by our Lord Jesus Christ. As a denomination, our Church had been in existence since 1897, under the leadership of the Most Reverend Francis Hodur. The first Polish National Catholic parish of St. Stanislaus Cathedral in Scranton, PA and many parishes throughout the USA joined together with their legal ownership of church properties, the parish government in secular matters was directed by parish committees elected by the parishioners and appointment of their pastors was approved by parishioners. This democratic system of the administration of the church was the only cause of the establishment of the PNCC. The consecration of the Rev, Francis Hodur by the Old Catholic Bishops of Holland in 1907 gave the Polish National Catholic Church of America that important direct line of Apostolic Succession. Apostolic Succession is the belief that bishops succeed one another in an unbroken chain from Christ himself through his apostles and their successors. Our PNCC church welcomes new members who are from other racial and cultural background. We become Church increasingly rich in diversity. My Brothers and Sisters let us continue our Lenten journey with more prayer fasting and giving alms so we would bear much fruit in the Lord. Amen.

LENTEN DEVOTION – STATIONS OF THE CROSS



On Fridays in Lent everyone is invited to attend Lenten Devotion of Stations of the Cross. Dates: March 23 (7:30 pm) and Good Friday March 30, 2021 at 3 pm with children and youth.

The 14 stations depict the following scenes: 1. Jesus is condemned to death; 2. Jesus accepts the cross; 3. Jesus falls the first time; 4. Jesus meets His Mother; 5. Simon of Cyrene carries the cross; 6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus; 7. Jesus falls the second time; 8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem; 9. Jesus falls the third time; 10. Jesus is stripped of His garments; 11. Crucifixion: Jesus is nailed to the cross; 12. Jesus dies on the cross; 13. Jesus' body is removed from the cross; 14. Jesus is laid in the tomb.

This liturgy helps us to meditate on the sufferings of Jesus and better understand his greatest love for us by dying on the cross for our sins.

THE GOSPEL Jn 15:1-8

The Vine and the Branches. "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.
