

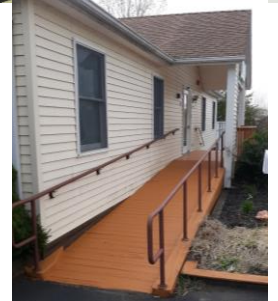

ST VALENTINE'S LUNCHEON

The legend says that St. Valentine was a Roman priest who in the 3rd century AD disobeyed the order of the emperor Claudius and secretly performed Christian weddings for couples. He allowed the husbands involved to escape recruitment into the pagan army. This legend claims that soldiers were sparse at this time so this was a big inconvenience to the emperor. The account mentions that in order "to remind these men of

their vows and God's love, Saint Valentine is said to have cut hearts from parchment", giving them to these persecuted Christians, a possible origin of the widespread use of hearts on St. Valentine's Day.

Another legend is that Valentine refused to sacrifice to pagan gods. Being imprisoned for this, Valentine gave his testimony in prison and through his prayers healed the guard's daughter who was suffering from blindness. On the day of his execution, St. Valentine left her a note that was signed, "Your Valentine".

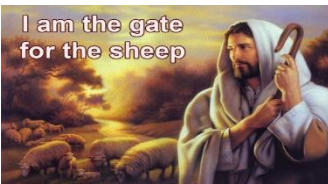

REFLECTION



Today is Good Shepherd Sunday, and we will hear in the Gospel that sheep recognize the true shepherd's voice. We may sometimes wonder where we "belong" in a world that seems so wrought by division. Jesus uses the ancient, but still powerful, image of the good shepherd who knows and protects his flock. Easter celebrates
