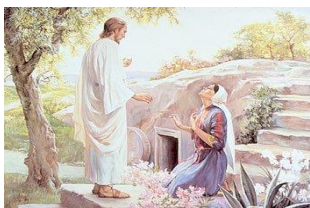

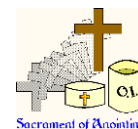

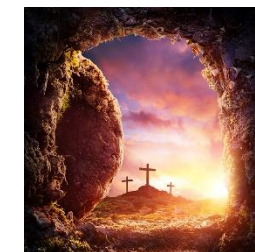

The bread and wine become the Body and Blood of our Lord during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass when the priest says words of consecration which Jesus used during the Last Supper: This is My Body... 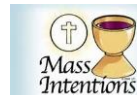
LASTING GIFTS - "Lasting Gifts, a guide for gifts to the Holy Cross Church."
