REFLECTION

The Humble Shepherds feast was called into being by the Synod that gathered in Scranton in 1906. The clergy and laity gathered at that time were for the most part poor, immigrant laborers. Many workers that time were coal miners. They worked very hard, often in horrible and dangerous conditions. And it was these very people who gathered at Synod when the PNCC was not even ten years old and voted to honor the humble shepherds of Bethlehem and all that they stood for. It took hard working people to recognize hard working shepherds. This feast remembers people who are disadvantaged in many ways in our society today. This Solemnity shows how God interacts with humanity. God sent His angels to the poor workers of the region to announce His salvation. In fact, He chose the lowest of the low to receive this news.




