

St. Blaise Blessing of the Throats



Holy Mass on February 4 will conclude with St. Blaise Blessing of the Throat. St. Blaise's Story — In 1222, the Council of Oxford prohibited servile labor in England on Blaise's feast day. The Germans and Slavs hold him in special honor, and for decades many United States Catholics have sought the annual St. Blaise blessing for their throats. We know that Bishop Blaise was martyred in his episcopal city of Sebastea, Armenia, in 316. The legendary "Acts of St. Blaise" were written 400 years later. According to

them, Blaise was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. During persecution in Armenia, Blaise was forced to flee to live as a hermit in solitude and prayer. He made friends with the wild animals. One day a group of hunters seeking wild animals stumbled upon Blaise's cave. They were surprised and frightened. The bishop was kneeling in prayer surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions and bears. The legend has it that as the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command the child was able to cough up the bone.

Agricolaus, governor of Cappadocia, tried to persuade Blaise to worship pagan idols. Blaise refused; he was martyred. Saint Blaise is the Patron Saint of throat ailments.

Music Scholarship Sunday - January 29

Next Sunday is Music Scholarship Sunday, designated to promote the Music Scholarship program of the National United Choirs of our Church and to recognize the choirs, organists, directors, and choir members for their contributions to the music ministry of our parishes. Through the financial support of parishioners throughout the PNCC, several endowments and awards are available to deserving applicants. Any parishioner who is paying for music lessons - vocal or instrumental - is eligible to apply.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity



An international Christian ecumenical observance kept annually between 18-25 **January** in the Northern Hemisphere, and around Pentecost in the Southern Hemisphere. This year for the reflection the Gospel of Luke 10:25-37 (Good Samaritan Parable) was chosen, and as a motto: "You shall love the Lord your God ... and your neighbor as yourself" (Lk 10:27). Jesus prayed that His followers

would all be one (cf. Jn 17:21), and so, Christians cannot lose hope or stop praying and working for unity. This call is a challenge for all Christians. Some can be anxious that ecumenism may lead to a loss of denominational identity and prevent church 'growth'. But rivalry between churches is counter to the prayer of Jesus. During the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, we ask the Lord to come to our assistance, to tend our wounds and so enable us to walk the way of ecumenism respecting other Christians groups with confidence and hope.


