INTRODUCTION

"Unbind him and let him go." Luke 11:44

Today we begin the Fifth Sunday of Lent and we hear about the story of Martha, Mary and their brother Lazarus. Jesus reminds Martha that her brother, Lazarus will rise again. She replies that she

is aware of that and then Jesus tells her that He is the resurrection and the Life and whoever believes in Him, even if he dies, will live and everyone who lives and believes in Him will never die. Today the Lord is asking all of us-Do you believe this? Because we believe what Jesus promised, there is great comfort in knowing that our loved ones who have lived and died in Christ will share eternal life with Jesus. Death is not the only loss we can experience in life, especially during these challenging times. There are little deaths such as illness, loss of a job, our security or something else that meant a lot to us. We have to trust that even in these little deaths, God is with us.



We pray for peaceful resolutions and reconciliation in different parts of the world especially in Ukraine, Gaza and Israel, and


