

INTRODUCTION

Today's readings remind us that prayer always begins with an attitude. It does not matter what we've done, how much we have, or who we are. What does matter is what is in our hearts. The constant message has been that God hears the cries of the poor. Whatever our circumstances, humility and a concern for justice matter most. This is either consoling or challenging, depending on the state of our hearts. Lord Jesus, you spoke to those who were self-righteous, like the Pharisee: Lord, have mercy. Christ Jesus, you taught that God hears the prayers of the humble: Christ, have mercy.
